### **PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

For over 40 years I have shouted "Alleluia" on Easter morning and have never really thought about what the word meant. So on a whim I looked it up and found out it means "Praise the Lord." Which probably seems obvious, but I'm really glad we say Alleluia because it's fun to say! Since then it's been a little bit of a code word for me to say to people who aren't particularly religious. Saying "Praise the Lord" to them or around them could make them feel a little awkward, and I want to be respectful of their feelings. Now when I hear good news, I often will exclaim, "Alleluia!" I've even been know to say it when I see a new shoot of



grass pushing through the ground, or a bird returning for the Spring! What makes you say "Alleluia?" I'd encourage you during this Easter Season to keep a running list of Alleluia moments, and you will likely be surprised at how often you want to "Praise the Lord!"

One Alleluia subject has to do with the fact that I have now completed a full year cycle of worshipping participating in the life of CLF. What a joy it has been! Last year after Easter I prayed about what new life looks like in our life together, and for God to reveal to us how together we are participating in the Resurrection of Jesus. This year has been one of new growth in this place. This list could go on and on. So let's start brainstorming! Then let's make a plan! Be watching for an opportunity this June for us to come together and put dreams and plans and visions into action. We are a generous, talented, passionate group of Jesus Followers, and God is calling us! Alleluia!


#### Greetings!



### PARISH NURSE

### PARISH NURSE UPDATE

High blood pressure or hypertension is a common condition that affect the body's arteries. When the blood pressure is too high the heart has to work harder to pump the blood through the arteries. A blood pressure over 130/80 is now considered to be hypertension.



Untreated high blood pressure increases the risk of heart attack, stroke and other serious health conditions. Usually there are no symptoms of high blood pressure as it usually develops over time. It is important to have your blood pressure checked at least every 2 years ages 18-39 unless there are risk factors, then at least yearly. People age 40 and older should have their blood pressure checked at least once a year. This is a great reason to stop & see me when I am taking blood pressures!

Risk factors include age, race and family history, obesity, tobacco use or vaping, low potassium levels, too much salt, stress, drinking too much alcohol, pregnancy and certain chronic conditions including kidney disease, diabetes and sleep apnea.

There can be some major complications of prolonged high blood pressure including heart attack, stroke, aneurysm, heart failure, kidney disease, eye problems, metabolic syndrome, changes in memory or understanding and dementia.

The sooner you are able to manage your high blood pressure the less risk of severe complications. If you have questions please speak to your provider.

### **Build-a-Mountain Summary**


