

GROWING ROOTS PRESCHOOL TO MOVE TO THE UPPER ROOM

As Growing Roots Preschool begins their second year they will be moving to a different place in the church. CLF is currently partnering with them to add two bathrooms to the Upper Room where they will move in the middle of August. We are so excited about this partnership and look forward to getting to know the kids and their families even better this year. The council approved a budget for the addition of the bathrooms as well as a remodel of the small kitchenette area. Our hope is that the preschool will be there for many years, but in the event that they outgrow the space and need to move, the remodel committee is looking to the future. The plan is to make sure the Upper Room is usable space for many years either for retreat use, or temporary living quarters, etc. Growing Roots will be organizing some fundraisers in order to help offset the cost of the addition/ remodel. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask Pastor Shannon or any members of the CLF Church Council. The committee that is heading up this project and organizing other volunteers consists of Lonnie White, Craig Black, Elmer Smolnisky, and Gene Fennell. We are so grateful for their hard work and expertise!

A lot of time, planning, work and effort has been put into getting the Upper Room, above the offices, ready for the Growing Roots Preschool. The preschool plans to make their move upstairs prior to school starting in the fall. The Upper Room is being remodeled to include some bathrooms and etc. for the preschool which will be a great asset for them.

PROPERTY CREW PROJECTS

Property Team Completes Woodshed for Firewood Ministry

A long-anticipated woodshed for the firewood ministry was completed July 16. The building will shelter CLF's two wood splitters and cut/split firewood. Fourteen volunteers contributed an estimated 140 hours over six days. Materials cost \$9,500. The firewood supports youth missions (sales) and the Pine Ridge ministry.

Other work in the outdoor worship area completed this spring included a new campfire ring, refurbished benches, four new (rebuilt) picnic tables, grass seeding and general cleanup. This work enhances the outdoor worship experience and invites additional uses for the area.

Project accomplishments are possible through dedicated volunteers who work to keep our facilities in top shape to deliver our worship and service ministries.

Also recently, you may have noticed that the parking lot lights have not been working correctly. Thanks to some volunteers and Freeman's Electric, they are now working. Thank you so much volunteers for all that you do!

Director for Rural Ministry Column

Beloved Travelers,

I am writing to you from the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans. I mentioned this because I would not have known about an especially helpful resource without the experience of 'the tAble." This is our church-wide gathering of youth and their accompanying adults who are under the umbrella of ELCA Disability Ministries. Here we put into practice the ever widening welcome for people of all abilities, and especially for young people of physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities.

This past week I had the privilege of working at the tAble with its Director, Pastor Jonathon Vehar (yes, he's our synod Director for Evangelical Mission) and USD Campus Pastor Lisa Heffermam. In the course of our work, Lisa and I engaged in a conversation about funding resources. She let me know that funds are still available in the 2024 Disability Ministries Grants. These are designated funds for ELCA congregations that have identified a need that "would be of a benefit to the disabled people in your setting and your ministry." Applications are being accepted through July 31, and more information can be found at https://blogs.elca.org/disabilityministries/disability-ministries-grants-2024/.

I fly back to South Dakota tomorrow, and I am eager to hit the road and begin the work of partnering with our South Dakota STaR congregations where we love to tell the story (as the lines from that much-loved hymn calls out) because we know it's true...that when fellow travelers of all backgrounds and abilities come to a STaR congregation we put into practice the ever widening welcome of Christ "which satisfies our longings as nothing else would do."





From the Bishop's Desk

Friends in Christ,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of the Risen One, Christ our Lord!

Traveling around the state and speaking to you this year has been challenging. It doesn't matter whether it's wind, rain, or hail that puts a damper on our hope, the matter of fact is that we find ourselves with the psalmist asking; "how long, oh Lord?" (Psalm 13:1). And as we take stock, count our losses and try to save what there is, we buckle down, pull ourselves up by our bootstraps and work harder. That's the kind of people we are. But what happens when our bootstraps reach their end or break?

That's one reason for Christ's vision for the church to be a community. What Gifts Do You Have?

Dear People of God,

Discernment: it's a big word. Essentially it means: "Perceiving the will and way of God in the church and in your life ... The question is not, "Do I have gifts for ministry?" The question is, "What gifts do I have and for which ministry are they best suited?" (What Shall I Say? Discerning God's Call to Ministry, P. 5)

There is a discernment resource called, "Call to Lead." Not only is it a great document for people who are considering public, ordained ministry, it has wonderful and thought-provoking questions throughout the who resource. Over the course of the next several synod newsletters, I will include language and questions from the document in order that we can be in self-contemplation, as well as conversations of faith with others synod-wide. Invite someone to coffee and put these questions in front of you. Christ promises to be present: For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them (Matt. 18:20)."

QUILTING



Rev. Jonathon Vehar, Associate to the Bishop and Director of Evangelical Mission, wanted to pass along this opportunity found in the ELCA July 2024 Mission Support Memo:

Though not all communities of faith are eligible for all grants, there are some grants for those who are going new and innovative ministry, especially with communities on the margins and vulnerable populations.

This webinar will explore both the technical side of grant writing (what you are funding and why?) as well as the process of funding grants and deciding if you fit the criteria.
