

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Oh how I hope that the saying "April Showers bring May flowers" is true! I am so excited to start planting flowers and watching things grow! Of course, after last year's un-welcoming response from the voles and moles, I've decided I need to be a little more creative this year. I've done research on plants that voles and moles and rabbits and deer don't like and plan to plant a few of those. Darryn has helped me design and build some raised beds, and as soon as I'm mostly sure the frost/snow days are over, I will be scattering seeds and planting plants that the critters can't reach! Then I will cross my fingers and toes, call upon whichever saints are supposed to protect the flora and fauna, and probably say some convincing prayers that things will grow.

This is a very minor example of what Hope looks like. But as we all know, even with all the preparation, planning, trying and trying again, superstitious practices, and prayers, there is no guarantee. I am well aware that I'm trying to change the natural course of things by trying to outwit Mother Nature Herself. Zinnias and dahlias and tomatoes and sugar snap peas don't grow naturally in the Black Hills. Yet, I'm still going to try because I like fresh flowers and fresh vegetables, and darn it...I really don't like voles and moles! Even as I type this I realize how ridiculous I sound. So you may ask me, "Why do you do this?" Honestly, I ask myself this every time I try something new.

My friends, I believe that we are called to keep trying to do new things that bring beauty and health and hope to our world, even when it doesn't seem possible. I believe we are called to never stop trying to figure out how to be "in the world and not of the World" as we are taught in the Gospel of John 17:14-17. The whole 17th chapter of John is Jesus prayer to his Father, God, to help his disciples have hope even in a world that has been corrupted by so much darkness, especially due to death, disease, dangerous political ideologies, and despair. Jesus doesn't want his disciples to become jaded and hopeless. In fact he prays, "But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves." (John 17:13).

This prayer is for us today as well. Yes, there are many reasons to feel frustrated. If we trust that Jesus continues to intercede for us today, then we do not give up. We continue to welcome people and live as honestly as we can by the welcome statement we claim each week at the table of Holy Communion... we say ALL are welcome and we strive to mean it! This, my friends, is what hope looks like. And if something isn't quiet working, we pay attention for the timing to be right to try new things so that we can follow the one who prays for every part of God's amazing creation. We trust and follow our Lord, Jesus, to show us the way of beauty, health, and salvation for all!

Parish Nurse Notes

I have been discussing finding a new Parish Nurse as I planned to retire soon. No decisions have been made that I am aware of, so any of you nurses out there who may want to continue this role, please talk with Pastor Shannon. I have enjoyed working with the members of our congregation in times of need. Now I am really hoping for someone to take on this position as my husband and I have made the difficult decision to return to the Sioux Falls area to be closer to our family. We have loved living in this beautiful area and all of the wonderful people we have met and the many friends made. Our home will be on the market by the time you receive this newsletter. I don't know what we will do without Custer Lutheran Fellowship which is very important to us. We do plan on visiting, as we are leaving behind some great friends and I will need to take a walk by Stockade Lake every once in a while!

Maintaining Healthy Bones

Healthy bones continuously break down and rebuild at the cellular level. As we age our bones break down faster, especially for women after menopause. Bone rebuilding can't keep pace with breakdown, bones deteriorate and become weaker which leads to osteoporosis.

A bone density test measures the amount of calcium in your hips and spine. When a woman reaches 65 they should have their initial bone density test and earlier if at higher risk. Risk factors that affect bone density include smoking, drinking to excess, long term steroid medication use, low body weight, rheumatoid arthritis, a personal or family history of low trauma fractures esp. hip fractures and a chronic medical condition linked to early menopause or chronic liver disease.

There are measures you can take in your daily life, such as focusing on your diet and exercise habits that can keep your bones healthy. Weight bearing exercises such as walking, moderate aerobic exercises and muscle strengthening exercises can also help. Aim for 30 minutes of exercise most days of the week. Eat a well balanced diet and making sure you are getting enough calcium and vitamin D from the food you eat. Don't smoke and limit alcohol.

Mental Wellness

There are so many aspects of mental wellness. It often involves coping with our emotions, feelings and self-worth. What I try to do is focus on different symptoms and illness involved with our state of mental wellness. Self-harm-People often keep this a secret from others but the urge isn't uncommon, especially in adolescents and young adults. Self-harm or self-injury means hurting oneself on purpose. Common ways are by cutting yourself or burning yourself or picking at wounds.

Hurting or thinking of hurting yourself is a sign of emotional distress. These uncomfortable emotions may become more intense when self-harm is continued. Self-harm also causes feelings of shame and scars may become permanent.

Self-harm is not a mental illness but a behavior that indicates a need for better coping skills. Those at most risk are people who have experienced trauma, neglect or abuse. The urge may begin with overwhelming anger, frustration or pain. When they don't know how to deal with their emotions, self-harm may feel like a release. If one does not feel many emotions, they may cause themselves pain in order to feel something "real". The first step is to tell a trusted adult. Treatment involves psychotherapy, cognitive behavioral therapy and learning better coping methods.
