While CLF has a contractor to keep the parking lot clear of snow, we need volunteers to keep the sidewalks clear.



## International Health Partners, U.S. & IHP-TZ



Dennis Lofstrom, M.D. and Paula Lofstrom, RN and Mary Ellen Kitundu, RN answered the call to bring health care to underserved people in Tanzania in 2002. Both Mary Ellen and Dennis have passed away. However, **Paula Lofstrom and her son, David West** are carrying on their legacies through the continued work of International Health Partners, U.S., & TZ.

In 2002 IHP began the restoration of lambi Lutheran Hospital in the Central Diocese of Tanzania, near Singida. Over the next four years the hospital went from seeing 2-3 patients a day in the clinic and having only 3 patients in the 170 bed facility, to seeing an average of 110 patients a day

and 80-90% occupancy in the rehabilitated hospital. The facility was then turned over to the church, fully staffed, fully equipped, and **self-sustaining**.

In 2006 IHP began building Nyakato Health Center near Mwanza, in the East of Lake Victoria Diocese of the Lutheran Church. Over the following 6 years, the clinic was seeing 120 patients a day, and the birthing center, surgery suite, eye center and wards were utilized and the clinic had 122,000 active charts. This facility was handed over to the diocese, fully staffed, fully equipped, and **self-sustaining**.

Seeing the needs for more nurses, IHP founded St. John's University School of Nursing in Dodoma. It opened in 2007. Under Mary Ellen's supervision it grew to graduate an annual average of 130 nurses with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. Now there are 1400 students in various healthcare programs.

It was the dream of Paula and Denny and Mary Ellen along with Mary Ellen's brother-in-law, the chief pediatrician in Tanzania, to build a pediatric hospital to serve the 22 million children under 15 years of age in Tanzania. Land was purchased, infrastructure brought in and building began at Zinga, about 35 miles north of Dar es Salaam, on the coast of the Indian Ocean. That facility opened in April 2016. Teams and medical students visited, served, and learned and then in 2020 Covid hit and visitors from other countries could no longer come. However, in Zinga, the services continued and still do. The staff felt ready to take over this project and IHP, as before, turned over a fully functioning, fully staffed, fully equipped healthcare faciality to the Tanzanians trained to run it.

Now, another challenging area is going to be served by IHP-US & TZ. Chihoni is about 24 miles northwest of Dodoma, in the central part of Tanzania. Women in this area are dying because they cannot reach a medical facility in time if they are in protracted labor. Working aged adult males have fled to the cities to find work leaving the elderly alone at home with no medical resources or transport to them. IHP is determined to change this, to serve the underserved, and to again be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ in the world today to bring healing and hope to God's children of all ages.

In her presentation Paula and her son David West will talk about the needs of the Tanzanian people and their own spiritual, mental, professional and geographic journey which has sustained them and brought them to Chihoni.

In addition to bringing education and inspiration, Paula and David will bring Tanzanian handicrafts to admire and sell them to raise funds in support of the facility at Chihoni. For more information, see their web page at http://www.ihptz.org.

## Stately Ponderosa Pine Comes Down - But Lives On



The saws were buzzing on October 12, a warm day when the dead stately ponderosa pine was felled by professional arborist, Rich Barry. It grew on the hillside between the parsonage and church, leaning over the propane tank and powerline and threatening buildings. The grizzled monarch inhabited the forest and meadow edge for about four centuries (estimated at 415 years). It stood about 75 feet tall and was 41½ inches across the stump. An obituary for this monarch may go something like this...

Our treasured pine was born about 1609, likely on a warm, pollen filled summer day in the Black Hills. It germinated among the rocky, shallow soil on a warm south slope. There it grew slowly but steadily in the warm Black Hills climate nurtured by summer thunderstorms and wet spring snows.

Much of its life it likely sheltered Indigenous people, including most recently the Lakota. It certainly witnessed Custer's expedition followed by the Gordon party's building of the stockade in the nearby meadow in 1874. Homesteaders soon followed.

Eventually in about 1965 Custer Lutheran Fellowship acquired the land beneath the stately pine, and upon it grew a congregation to serve Christ, its members and the community. That pine, the days after its removal, saw *Growing Roots Pre-School* children playing among the very large chunks of wood that will remain for their enjoyment. A portion will likely be converted to a table, and a crew processed the remainder into firewood to warm residents of the Red Shirt Community. Truly, that pine is emblematic of CLF as envisioned, "God's spirit blows through people – like wind through pines – life that is forever new!"


