In September we will organize a trip to the Reconciliation Center to drop off our offerings and enjoy some fellowship time with residents of the Pine Ridge and perhaps help prepare a meal or even help with some work projects. Please join us! Stay tuned as plans develop.

• Assembling birthday bags/kits for WEAVE residents. These kits contain cake mix, frosting, candles and other items for residents who are celebrating birthdays during their stay.

CLF REMODELS FOR GROWING ROOTS PRESCHOOL

A crew recently completed remodeling of the "Upper Room" in the education wing to add boys & girls bathrooms and update a small kitchenette area for the *Growing Roots Preschool*. They were guided by a floor plan that envisioned long-term needs. *Growing Roots* will move from the existing space in the Down Under feeling that full space to be used by the Spark Kids after school program and high school RAP Group on Wednesdays. The project was guided by Lonnie White, Craig Black, Elmer Smolnisky and Gene Fennell with hands-on construction support by others. CLF Council reported that this project meets a critical need for additional pre-school/day care options in the community.

He contacted Pastors Barbara Wangsness and Natanael Lizarazo and they were his guides with what he did and where he went from that point on. They are in New Braunfels, Texas. If anyone wants to go to see what he saw, he suggested working with them because they have been in this kind of ministry along time although retired now.

They took him to Eagle Pass, which is one of the three main crossing areas in connection without area. There were three churches operating large facilities to help people through the transition into America. The Saint Benedictine sisters, the United Methodist Church, and the ELCA Lutheran Church.

Larry learned of ways to help and he shared them with us. He is making a report to the Synod this week and then we will learn more. Next month, we will share more about his time at Eagle Pass with each of those facilities and how the Synod looks to be involved going forward.

Contributions in July increased approximately \$11,000 from June. Most were unrestricted, but approximately \$5,450 was restricted for an additional debt payment. Our loan balance is currently \$52,575.

COUNCIL MINUTES - August 20, 2024

Agenda Additions/Approval

There were 2 additions to the agenda. There was consensus and the agenda was approved as amended.

Secretary's Report: The correspondence was reviewed Craig moved, Mark seconded and the minutes for the July meeting were approved. Worship attendance records were reviewed.

Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report: The offerings thru July were 94.6% (-\$11,441.27) of budget and expenses were 87.9% (-\$31,063.75) of budget.

Joy & Sara met with the audit committee for a mid-year review. Went over some of the "Internal Control Best Practices" which CLF does follow. Next meeting will be in December.

Special Agenda Items:

There were no special agenda items.

Pictorial Directory – Helena moved, Mark seconded to use the Instant Church Directory software along with the online app option. Motion passed.

- **Upper Bathroom Update –** Craig gave an update. The final electrical inspection is done. Plumbing and fixtures in bathrooms finishing up.
- **Internet/Phones –** Will be having a Golden West Tech person from Rapid City give us an estimate on how to proceed with our internet issues.
- WNL/Confirmation Update Discussed ways to implement meals. On a 5th Wednesday there would be no WNL but instead recommend families have a family night. Could possibly have 11 students this year. Confirmation Sunday will be moved to October, there will be no students confirmed this October.

New Business:

Membership changes: None

Pastor Shannon's Student Loans – Council discussed helping Pastor Shannon with her student loans. Helena moved, Craig seconded to pay \$3,000/year up to a total of \$15,000. Motion passed.

- **Fire Management Response System –** Monitoring will now be done using a cell phone rather than a dedicated phone line.
- **Board Development –** Dave Versteeg has experience with board development so could help CLF with different models to implement. Craig moved, Helena seconded to invite him to the September Council meeting. Motion passed. Sara to contact him.

Rearranging Rooms – Pastor Shannon would like to remove the chairs from the Family Room off the Narthex to make it a small nursery closer to the Sanctuary.

Other –

Outlaw Ranch Request – OR has a possible request for a group of 300 people coming next August. They only have room for 190. They want to know if CLF could host 30 youth with adult. Consensus was that we could and could possible host more youth if needed.

Policies & Procedures – The current policies & procedures of what we have need to be updated. Pastor Shannon, Helena and Donna will work on.

Pastor's Report:

Review Worship & Activities – Things are going well. Outdoor worship is winding down and things are in progress for the Fall activites.

Property, Mark Thompson – Will cost \$800-1,000 to remove a dead tree behind the church. Craig moved, Helena seconded to have tree removed. Motion passed.

Social Ministry, Craig Black – Reviewed committee activity. Craig move, Mark seconded that any mission/ outreach project funds will be managed by the Social Ministry Committee. Motion passed.
