### GOOD NEWS ON THE IMPACT OF CLF'S MISSION GIVING!



For a number of years individual members of Custer Lutheran Fellowship have provided restricted donations to the church to fund the Delta Dental mobile program in Custer, SD.

This program, run by the Delta Dental of SD Foundation, brings a mobile dental unit to Custer each fall and provides preventive and restorative dental care to Custer children. In 2024, 26 Custer area children received services valued at \$33,183 (a 10 fold return) on the \$3,000 participation fee.



### RAISING UP LEADERS

Last year one of the Outlaw Ranch Staff, Julianna Jimenez, officially joined our congregation. Julianna is from Columbia, but has worked at Outlaw and worshipped at CLF for 5 seasons. This fall, she discerned a call to ministry and is pursuing her MDiv at Wartburg Theological Seminary. We are considered her Home congregation and she is a student of the South Dakota Synod. #### Happy New Year!

As many of you are aware, for the last year Jenn Doyle (our Music and Worship Director) and I have been planning our Sunday Worship around the Scripture readings from the Narrative Lectionary. This is slightly different than the three year Revised Common Lectionary in that it begins in September with readings from the Old Testament, then after Christmas focuses on one of the four Gospels until Easter, then moves into the Letters of Paul. The Narrative Lectionary is a four year cycle in order to give us time to really focus on one Gospel per year. This year, beginning on January 12<sup>th</sup>, we will be diving into the Gospel according to Luke. Last year we gathered together at my house and read the entire Gospel of Mark in one setting.

I would like to do the same thing this year! It took us almost two hours to get through Mark, and Luke is a little bit longer, so I'm planning a whole evening around it. If you came last year, you remember that we were pretty cozy (as in scrunched together) because so many of you came. What a wonderful time it was! Therefore, I'm going to schedule two opportunities to join me at my home and put out sign up sheets so I can have plenty of food and beverages to share while we read. The first opportunity will be Sunday, January 5<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 PM until we finish (hopefully by 7:30 at the latest). The second opportunity will be Saturday, January 11<sup>th</sup> same times, 3:00 PM until we finish. The limit per group will be 15 which will still be cozy, but comfortable. If I need to schedule another time because so many of you want to join in...what a lovely problem that would be!!!

If you are not able to attend, I would strongly encourage you to take some time to read through the whole book of Luke, and try to read it like you would any other book, but try to do it in as few settings as possible.

The purpose for this suggestion to read it all the way through is to help us all engage more fully in the Sunday Sermons each week. Narrative is another word for Story...and if you are aware of the full story, then each chapter and verse makes a little more sense.

This year my prayer is that we as a congregation can continue to grow in our Biblical studies, to let God's Word sink into our souls and open our hearts and minds to Jesus' mission in the world today and in this New Year. I know that every time I study the Bible something inside of me changes and grows, and I would love that to be the case for you, too!

Custer Lutheran Fellowship Recycling Plastic Film Project Team - the title will never fit on a sweatshirt! Would you consider being part of the team? For the past year, CLF has worked with the Custer Lions Club with our one collection box. We collected over 200 lbs. (20) bags.

The Lions Club is discontinuing their collection as a project, so I'm asking CLF members to join me in caring for creation by expanding to take over their collection boxes. There are 5 collection boxes around Custer. I think 5-6 people to collect. They would be weighed and set aside at the church and then people going to Rapid City could drop them off at Kohl's. You literally drop them off just inside the main door - "No checking in". We keep the record of the bags with the weight and photos and report each month. There is a TREX bench awarded for each thousand pounds in a year, but that's just the "frosting".

November contributions were comparable to October. The total contribution revenue in excess of the budget are attributed to restricted donations and firewood sales. November year-to-date unrestricted contributions and operating expenses were 95% and 99% to budget, respectively.

#### MISSION OF THE MONTH

This year CLF will be sponsoring a Mission of the Month Program, highlighting an outreach mission each month. In the past our noisy offering, taken once a month, was used to donate to these mission projects. This year, the noisy offering will continue to be given to the monthly project, but it will be expanded so that persons who wish to donate more than their loose change can have an opportunity to donate throughout the whole month. An offering canister will be set up in the hallway of the church, with the name of the month's project so persons can donate to the cause anytime. Hopefully this offers an opportunity for persons to give more to specific mission causes as they choose.

JANUARY MISSION OF THE MONTH—WOYATON CHURCH WARMING BUS AND HOMELESS MINISTRIES The following is a letter from Tracey Sigdestad who works with Wambli Ska, a part of Woyaton, which is the ELCA Lutheran Lakota Church in Rapid City.

"Urban Native American Community in Rapid City: The Indigenous community, primarily Lakota, makes up about 10% of Rapid City's population but faces significant hardships, including poverty, unemployment, inadequate housing, and limited healthcare access. Particularly in North Rapid City, where our organization is based, conditions resemble third world scenarios, with stark disparities in income, education, health, and safety. Native Americans comprise nearly 50% of the city's homeless population, despite being only a tenth of its residents.

Strengthening Connections Street Outreach Program: Strengthening Connections, the state's only 100% Indigenous led and culturally responsive street outreach program, is made possible by the support of our community. We actively engage homeless individuals through outreach efforts that provide basic necessities, connect them to our programs, and help them navigate available resources. Our teams work tirelessly to build trust, offer support, and help individuals navigate their paths toward stability and self-sufficiency. Street Outreach is a process of building a personal connection that may help a person improve his or her housing, health status, and/or social support network. Through these relationships, many chronically homeless people have moved from the streets to permanent housing and toward independence. Service Recipients include youth, adults, and families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, intoxicated, experiencing a behavioral or mental health crisis, or engaging in disruptive behavior or experiencing crises.

Emergency Shelter and Day Center: Our street outreach program uncovered critical gaps in services, particularly the absence of culturally responsive support and emergency shelter, especially during SD's harsh winters. Many relatives have been lost due to exposure to these conditions. To address this, we opened an emergency shelter at Woyatan Church, providing shelter during the winters of 2021 & 2022. The shelter offered 100 beds, served 3 meals daily, and fed nearly 200 people per day. Staff assisted guests with obtaining documents, housing applications, medical appointments, job searches, and transportation to services. In 2023, after the closure of the Hope Center, we assumed its services by establishing the Pejuta Waste Otipi Day Center and Emergency Shelter. In the first six months, we served 4,213, overnight guests, providing mail services to 162 individuals, served 20,651 meals, facilitated 627 showers, & engaged 642 volunteers; Pejta Waste Otipi has since become its own 501 c3 although we work closely together.

Warming Bus Program: For over two years, the warming bus has served as a mobile warming center during the coldest months in Rapid City. This initiative was born out of necessity when our emergency shelter faced operational challenges due to city restrictions. With shelters in the area consistently at full capacity, many of our homeless relatives were left with no options for safe shelter. The warming bus provided a dignified, life-saving alternative, offering warmth, seating, blankets, hot beverages, and a space for individuals to rest and recharge. Our outreach workers also use this opportunity to connect individuals with longer term resources such as housing assistance, healthcare, and mental health services. ### OFFICE ADMINISTRATOR POSITION RESTRUCTURE

As many of you are aware, there will be some changes coming to the CLF office. After much discussion and prayer, the CLF council has decided to restructure the position description of the Office Administrator to reflect more use of technology and computer software and programs. Mary has graciously been willing to continue to serve in her position until another person has been hired. The position has been announced and we have begun receiving and interviewing applicants. ### **CONSTITUTIONAL REVISIONS**

#### **CONSTITUTIONAL REVISIONS**

The church council is currently in the process of reviewing policies and procedures for CLF. One of the first things we are working on is a Council Handbook. After much discussion it was approved by the council to make some revisions to the current constitution regarding the election of council members. The purpose of this is to have a more consistent approach to terms of all council members. Basically what is being proposed is that all members of the council will be considered at large and are elected to a three year term, but can serve two consecutive terms. Then the council will elect from within the 8 people the officers, President, Vice President, and Secretary. The Treasurer will continue to be appointed by the Council. Whomever is elected then would be eligible to serve up to 3 years as opposed to two years.

At the Annual meeting, we will have a special meeting of the congregation at the very beginning to vote on these changes. Once the vote is taken, if passed will go into effect immediately. Then we will proceed with the Annual Meeting. Following are the proposed changes:

\*C5.03. Only such authority as is delegated to the Congregation Council or other organizational units in this congregation's governing documents is recognized. All remaining authority is retained by the congregation. The congregation is authorized to:

j. elect its President, Vice President, Congregation Council, and other committees as specified in Chapter
 13 and require them to carry out their duties in accordance with the constitution, bylaws, and/or continuing resolutions; and

### **Chapter 11**

#### **OFFICERS**

\*C11.01. The officers of this congregation shall be a president, and vice president, and secretary.

- a. Duties of the officers shall be specified herein.
- b. The officers shall be voting members of the congregation.
- c. The officers shall be selected from the elected membership of the congregation council.
- \*C11.02. The congregation council shall elect from its own members a president, vice-president and a secretary who shall be its officers and they shall be the officers of the congregation. The officers shall be elected by written ballot (except in cases where a unanimous ballot is cast) and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. The officers shall be elected in the first congregation council meeting following the annual meeting and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. Their terms shall begin immediately upon being elected.at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.

\*C11.02.02 The congregation council shall appoint a person to serve as congregation secretary. The term shall begin at the close of the meeting at which he or she is appointed.

\*C11.02.02 The congregation council shall appoint a person to serve as congregation financial secretary. This person will have the privilege of voice without vote unless elected to the congregation council and shall serve for one year or until a successor is appointed. The term shall begin at the close of the meeting at which he or she is appointed.

#### **CONGREGATION COUNCIL**

\*C12.01. The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the [senior] pastor, the president and vice president of the congregation, and six eight at-large members of the congregation. The congregation may elect a youth representative as an additional voting member for a one year term. Any voting member of the congregation may be elected, subject only to the limitation on the length of continuous service permitted in that office. A member's place on the Congregation Council shall be declared vacant if the member a) ceases to be a voting member of this congregation or b) is absent from four successive regular meetings of the Congregation Council without cause. Consistent with the laws of the state in which the congregation is incorporated, the congregation may adopt procedures for the removal of a member of the Congregation Council in other circumstances.

\*C11.03. No officer shall hold more than one office at a time. No elected officer shall be eligible to serve more than two three consecutive terms in the same office.
